PERRY COUNTY OVERVIEW:

Between 2013 and 2017 there were a total of 2,710 crashes reported within Perry County, Ohio. Around 910 people were injured as result of these crashes which includes 17 fatalities and 253 serious injuries. Overall however there has been an increase in the total number of crashes, with 7.37% more crashes in 2017 compared to 2013. There has been a similar increase in the number of injury crashes.

KEY FACTS:

- There's been a 7.37% increase in crashes between 2013 and 2017.
- On average, there 3 fatal crashes per year between 2013 and 2017. That's roughly 1 fatal crash every 4 months.
- Between 2013 and 2017, there were 1226 fixed object crashes (45.2% of total crashes), making this the most common crash type overall and accounts for the largest number of fatalities.
- Pedalcycle, pedestrian, train, overturning, angle, and head on were the crash types most likely to result in an injury or fatality.
